My sincere thanks to Lyce Rozario for continuing to head the Social Committee and to the rest of the committee, who, along with Lyce, willingly put in countless hours of hard work so that the members of our Casa can all continue to enjoy these wonderful events with all their delicious food, lively company, and entertainment.
